ENERGY RECOVERY AT THE WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

The Energy Recovery System at the Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) is now in operation again. The system was taken out of service while a major plant upgrade project was completed, and most recently in 2022, for cleaning and repairs. The Energy Recovery System consists of a cogeneration engine, two hot water boilers, a heat loop and three heat exchangers. The cogeneration engine was replaced in 2002.

One of the WWTP's core functions is processing solids. The first phase of solids processing is solids reduction, which is accomplished using four anerobic digesters. The digesters are large, circular enclosed tanks that are heated to 98 degrees. This process reduces the total solids content by approximately 50%. The breakdown of solids causes the production of methane gas. The cogeneration engine uses the methane gas as a fuel source that powers other plant equipment, thereby reducing the power the City would otherwise buy from PG&E.

The hot water generated from the cogeneration engine's cooling system is fed into a heat loop that heats the digesters to the required temperature of 98 degrees. By using the hot water generated by the cogeneration engine to heat the digesters, the hot water boilers are typically not called to run. When there is no demand for the hot water boilers, the daily natural gas consumption for the WWTP is significantly reduced.

- closes the gap on emissions from methane, a more potent greenhouse gas than carbon, from food waste in the landfill
- revitalizes your soil's health without synthetic fertilizers

SENIOR FOOD PROGRAM

The Pinole Senior Center will be partnering with the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano County on the Senior Food Program. Low-income senior citizens 55+ will be able to receive free groceries, including healthy pantry staples, eggs, cheese and assorted meats twice a month. The program at the Pinole Senior Center is available for Pinole senior residents ONLY. It will be every second and fourth Tuesday of the month. The next distribution will be on Tuesday, March 28th. The new distribution time will be 10:00 am - 11:00 am.

PLASTIC WISE PINOLE: SINGLE-USE PLASTICS REDUCTION



A vision for a healthier and cleaner Pinole! The City of Pinole is currently working on an initiative, Plastic Wise Pinole, in the hopes of transitioning Pinole away from single-use plastic bags and foodware. Single-use plastics are unhealthy and unsustainable for our wellbeing as well as our planet's. Microplastics can be found in our blood. A trash study of the Pinole Creek found single-use food packaging to be a major pollutant.

Two surveys are live: Resident/Visitor and Business Survey to gather the public's thoughts on regulation of single-use plastics. Surveys will take approximately 5-8 minutes to complete.
